Asylum Seekers Relief Project

“ICE (U.S. Immigration & Customs Enforcement) is dropping off 140 people sometime today... ICE is dropping off 90 today... Rumor has it there are another 100 at the bus station... Bus station no longer allowing people inside if they don't have a ticket... ICE is dropping off at a location near the bus station as they can't be in the parking lot any more... Can you find a church to let 90 people sleep for the night? Can you find a church to take 40? 140? 200?” “They only need shelter for one night, maybe two, three at the max.” CAN SOMEBODY HELP?

We are so blessed as a Conference to be able to share that many of our churches throughout the geographic area of the Conference *are* responding. They *are* providing shelter and many other needs, such as food, clothing, backpacks, medical help, small stuffed animals, travel sized toiletries, interpretation, and transportation.

While the donations of the items mentioned above are needed and are coming in part from our churches, this Annual Conference offering is specific and unique from those requests. We want to provide funding for capital support to help with this emergency shelter and organizing effort. A newly beginning cancer support group is being formed for those currently experiencing a cancer journey. Kathy “Joy” Huijbregts, recipient of the 2018, Nevada Childhood Cancer Foundation’s Person of Courage award, is leading the support group. Diagnosed with cancer in 2014, shortly after moving to Boulder City, she continues traditional as well as natural treatments with eight health care providers.

Joy will share her unconventional cancer journey taking participants from their fear and shock diagnosis to experiencing cancer as a sacred journey of self-awareness and personal growth. The first meeting will be held at the Smith Center on Friday, May 24, from 11:00am - 12:30 pm. A weekly theme will address individual’s needs and concerns in a positive environment while exchanging research and resources, with time for discussion and questions.

Huachuca UMC Fire Relief

October 18, 2018: first responders arrive at the Huachuca United Methodist Church in Huachuca City. The majority of the church is destroyed by a massive fire. Investigators determine the cause is arson. Later that month a second fire occurs; a brush fire near the church. November 27, 2018: a third fire. Debris catches fire in the chapel and fellowship hall – the two areas spared in the October fire. Again, the fire is suspicious in origin. December 8th, 2018: a 15-year-old male Huachuca City resident is arrested as part of the ongoing investigation into the arson fires, criminal damage, and trespassing of OUR church.

You’ll remember the Zion United Methodist Church (North Las Vegas) fire and our response in 2017. Youths were arrested in that fire as well.

This Annual Conference offering will help our church in Huachuca City rebuild its space on holy ground. A place to share God’s word, our faith in action. A place for the church to be the church. Perhaps a place to reach out to troubled youth who need to hear about God’s love so very, very much.
